The Francis Davies Collection

An Important Collection Of British Antarctic 'Terra Nova' Expedition 1910-1913 archive material of Leading Shipwright Francis Davies, RN.

Francis Edward Charles Davies (1885-1952), a Plymothian, who was the Royal Navy Carpenter and Shipwright aboard the RYS Terra Nova and a member of many later Polar Expeditions. Davies' name is commemorated by Davies Bay, situated between Drake Head and Cape Kinsey which was discovered in February 1911.

Francis Davies was a Plymouth man through and through. He was born and brought up in the Lower Crabtree and Laira Green area of the city and on leaving school, attained a shipwright's apprenticeship at the Royal Naval Dockyard, Devonport. After working in Devonport and as shipwright on H.M.S. Vanguard he heard mention of Captain Scott's plans for an expedition to the Antarctic and that shipwrights were required. He applied, was accepted and joined the British Antarctic Expedition on 30th May 1910. He signed on at Poplar, London.

His recollections of the Terra Nova, her crew and of the Expedition have been recently published in a book 'With Scott Before The Mast'. , from his first impressions of seeing the Terra Nova and meeting both Captain Scott and Captain Oates, to the sadness shared among the whole expedition party on hearing of the death of their friends and colleagues. The auction includes many of the photographs, letters and artefacts included within the book, which highlights the monumental task of organising and preparing for the British Antarctic Expedition.



Charged with preparing both the ship and the expedition huts, Davies became well known among his crewmates and his character soon earned him the nickname of 'Chippy'. Davies established many friendships on the expedition, not only did he have a rapport with Captain Oates, but also became friends with sailors and scientists alike including Harry Pennell, Edward Atkinson and Edward Wilson.

As the Terra Nova was an old ship she gave Davies many problems on the expedition. Three pieces in particular, the windlass, hand pump and steering gear required constant attention and they were referred to by Davies as his 'babies'. On the voyage from Port Chalmers to the Pole the hand pump became blocked during a severe storm and the ship was in danger of sinking. Davies played a vital role along with Lieutenant Evans cutting through a bulkhead to get to the pump to make repairs. Such were Davies' talents at keeping the Terra Nova running that, despite his desire to stay

with Scott and the Southern party, Lieutenant Harry Pennell insisted that Davies stay aboard in order to ensure that the Terra Nova could continue to sail.

Davies was vital in the successful manufacturing and construction of the huts to be used by the expedition. It is testament to his character that he questioned the factory sales representative supplying the timber saying that the lengths the factory were supplying would not be sufficient once they reached their intended destination. After the representative rebuked Davies, he took it upon himself to go the factory and see the foreman who agreed with him. Summoned before Captain Scott the following day and faced by a disgruntled sales representative, Davies stood his ground and Captain Scott sided with his crewman to demand the factory supply the correct timber for the expedition huts. Among the papers in the collection is an updated invoice from the factory with a note 'details as taken by your carpenter'. The main hut, which has now been conserved, is known as 'Scott's Hut', about which Captain Scott wrote 'We are simply overwhelmed by its comfort'.

Perhaps the most historically important pieces Davies kept after the expedition are charts 'Antarctic Ocean Sheet VIII and IV'. Each with details plotting the course for the Terra Nova from 1910 to 1913 with dates and annotations and detailing the voyages off South Victoria, McMurdo Sound, the Bay of Whales together with notes of the dates entering and leaving the pack ice. Captain Scott would have stood over these with other senior crew, discussing the ship's progress before committing his thoughts to his diary. Certainly the slow progress through the pack ice from December 20th to the 23rd 1910 gave him concerns, though he writes of the crew 'A spirit of tolerance and good humour pervades the whole community, and it is glorious to realise that men can love under conditions of hardship, monotony and danger in such bountiful good comradeship'

Francis Davies played a key part in maintaining the morale aboard the Terra Nova, as well as honouring the lives of their friends by making the memorial cross which still stands on Observation Hill today. A poem written aboard the Terra Nova at McMurdo Sound on the 18th January 1913 by another crewman, entitled 'They Died Like Men' is also included in the collection.

Following the British Antarctic Expedition, Francis Davies served aboard H.M.S. Blanche 1914-1918 and H.M.S. Exmouth in 1918. In 1919 he went to Archangel in Russia and was placed in charge of docking and repairs to all shipping operating in the White Sea and Severnaya Dvina River. In 1919-20 he served in H.M.S. Sandhurst in the Baltic. He took voluntary early retirement from the Royal Navy in 1920. Between the years 1927-34 he served in increasingly senior roles in the Royal Research Ships 'Discovery II' and the 'William Scoresby' which were engaged in scientific work in the Southern oceans. Also during this period, in August 1932, he passed the Board of Trade Examination for Certificate of Competency as Master (Steamship – Foreign going).

He volunteered and served in the Second World War and was granted a Temporary Commission as a Lieutenant RNVR on 18th April 1940 and was appointed to H.M.S. Victory III for Special Service in Norway where he was commended for his services by the Rear Admiral, Narvik and the NOIC Harstead. He returned to this country and was transferred to RNR and the Boom Defence Department. Later promoted to Lieutenant Commander RNVR, his final appointment was as Boom Defence Officer, Grimsby.

Commander Harry Lewin Lee Pennell (1882 - 31 May 1916) served on the expedition as commander of the Terra Nova whilst Captain Scott and his party were on the ice. Popular among many members of the party, Herbert Ponting recalled in his book that Pennell was 'the most energetic man I have ever known... when Pennell was not occupied with navigating problems, he was either on watch, or conning from the crow's-nest, or else out on the yard-arms helping the seaman set or shorten sail, or otherwise assisting in the handling of the ship. He was a 'whale for work' (1). As they were both Devonians (2) Francis Davies and Harry Pennell established a strong friendship aboard the Terra Nova. During the Hydrographic Survey of Admiralty Bay, Davies assisted Pennell with navigation, 'I usually gave Pennell a hand with the chart, I set the angles on the station pointers for him and he plotted the soundings'. (3)



After the Expedition Harry Pennell was promoted to the rank of Commander and assigned to HMS Queen Mary. He was skilled aboard her when on the 31st May 1916 during the Battle of Jutland, she was torpedoed by SMS Seydlitz and SMS Derfflinger.




Edward Leicester Atkinson (1881-1929) RYS Terra Nova surgeon/parasitologist, an archive of nineteen letters to 'Chippie' F E C Davies 1910 to 1940 on various letterheads including 'HMS St Vincent First Battle Squadron' and '15 Queen Anne Street, Cavandish Square'. The letters cover the immediate post Expedition period and First World War. In a letter dated the 16th July 1913, to 'Dear Chippie' Atkinson asks Davies 'Have you been able to do anything to the plans of hut and ship yet as I want to send in the Report to the Admiralty'. Other topics include the loss of fellow team member Harry Pennell aboard HMS Queen Mary, correspondence with other expedition members Tom Crean (1877-1938) and Cherry Garrard (1886-1959). In a letter dated 19th June, 1916 Atkinson writes 'The Committee have offered me the command of the search party for Shackleton's Relief and I had asked for Captain Pennell for the ship. I wish to god it had come off and he had been out of the Queen Mary'. Together with a copy of 'With Scott Before the Mast'.




Atkinson was in command of the Expedition party at Cape Evans once the Southern party had left for the pole. He was considered a trusted member of the party as Harry Pennell noted 'an out and out gentleman with the quiet self-assurance that makes a man without making him offensive' (1) However, Pennell also privately observed that Atkinson could also 'take a dislike to someone on very short acquaintance on very insufficient grounds'.(2). On the voyage south from Cardiff, Atkinson and Oates were detailed to Davies to work as carpenters when not otherwise employed on deck (3) Davies again establishing a strong friendship with his fellow crew as post expedition correspondence states. Atkinson had led the search party for Scott and his team and discovered them on the 12th November 1912, eleven miles south of 1 Ton Depot. During WWII Atkinson was approached regarding the relief party for Shackleton's Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition 1914-1917 that had become stranded in the Weddell Sea.





After the Expedition it appears that Davies and Pennell continued to correspond and met up at Pennell's home in Awliscombe, Devon. Harry Pennell discusses obtaining plans and a description of 'the ship' (Terra Nova) most probably for his memoirs. Captain Scott notes in his diary on the 7th December, 1910, that 'First Ice' was spotted at dinner. This was to be the start of a frustrating period of twenty days for the expedition as the Terra Nova struggled to make passage through the pack ice.

A summary in Scott's Diary notes that on two separate occasions, the ship stopped and fires were doused for a period of five days and four and half days. After leaving on the 26th February 1911, the Terra Nova continued her duties of surveying the region and carrying supplies back and forth.

It had been Scott's intention to land at Cape Cozier and establish his base camp there. On Tuesday 3rd January 1911 Scott's diary entry for 6pm, notes 'No Good!! Alas! Cape Crozier with all its attractions is denied us'. A whale boat was lowered and a party set out to locate a suitable place to land. Finding themselves unable to land at familiar points from previous expeditions, they settled on an inlet between Cape Royds and Cape Armitage, which Scott named 'Cape Evans'. After Scott had landed at Cape Evans, the Terra Nova set off to take Lieutenant Campbell and his group of five men to the King Edward VII Peninsula coast. Finding the route blocked by hazardous pack ice, Lt. Pennell decided to head for the Bay of Whales area where they discovered the 'Fram' and Amundsen's Winter Quarters(1). Subsequent surveying and supply journeys are also marked on the chart as well as notable points, most significantly both '1 Ton Depot' and 'Southern Party's Tent'





Davies was concerned that the saw-mill was supplying the cladding timbers by yardage irrespective of the precise length of the boards required, which would mean a shortage of timber due to waste cuts. He travelled to the mill to check the order and after confronting the mill foreman who ignored his concerns he reported the matter to Captain Scott. Scott understood that Davies was correct and informed the firm that unless there was sufficient timber supplied, they would not be paid. During a conversation with Lieut Pennell towards the end of the expedition regarding what he thought his finest achievement was, Davies replied ' getting the huts away complete from London'(1)

After retiring from the Royal Navy, Cunningham continued to serve aboard various vessels travelling several times around the world giving lectures on his travels in a series called 'Notes on Travel', He was also at one point Vice President of the Philosophical Society of New South Wales and worked as an assistant surgeon for both the Queensland Government Offices and British Guiana. Having undertaken several gold surveying Expeditions to Ashanti he became a correspondent for 'The Lancet', providing both reports and sketches for the Egyptian Campaign 1882-89.

Under increasing operations by the Japanese the coordination of the evacuation became impossible. Attempting to escape on a small motor launch Spooner and around 40 others became stranded on a small island. Despite search efforts by the British, the lack of fresh water and food on the small island forced the survivors to surrender to the Japanese. Sadly Spooner had died of exhaustion and malaria before the surrender.

HMS Tartar was a Tribal-class destroyer of the Royal Navy built in 1907 serving in the English Channel and North Sea during WWI. In April 1918 she struck and sank the merchant ship 'Argantock' of West Harlepool. HMS Tartar was eventually sold for scrap in May 1919.

Richard Gregory Coole near Gort", the case 33.5 x 21.4 x 2.6cm with typewritten transcript to back of the case.

Thomas William Poppleton (1775-1827) was born in England and served with General Daumier's Regiment while stationed in Galway, Ireland. He transferred to the 53rd Regiment of Foot and served in the Peninsular Wars in Egypt and in Baird's Desert March to India. He then became orderly to the Governor of St. Helena, Sir Hudson Lowe and in turn to Napoleon himself when he was exiled to the island in 1815. Napoleon's captors were issued with strict supervisory orders so as not to repeat the same mistakes as Elba. In this role Poppleton became close to his prisoner out of respect for him being a fellow soldier. In 1817 Sir Hudson Lowe believed an escape attempt was imminent and ordered Poppleton to report all conversations with Napoleon or anything overheard during daily duties. Poppleton resigned his position as he did not wish to undertake the role of a spy and he transferred to the 12th Regiment of Foot. Upon his leaving St Helena, Napoleon gifted a silver snuffbox to Poppleton which was passed down through generations of the Martin family. Major Poppleton is buried in the Martin family vault at Killannin.

Richard Gregory (1790-1847) built up the family estate at Coole Park, Galway and died there after caring for tenants suffering from an outbreak of the plague. The estate remained within the family until it was sold in 1927 to the Irish State by Margaret Gregory, daughter-in-law to Lady Augusta Gregory (1852-1932). The house was demolished in 1941 and the site is now a nature reserve. The Gregory Family papers (1770-1956) are held at the Stuart A. Rose Manuscript, Archives and Rare Book Library, Robert W. Woodruff Library, Emory University, Atlanta, GA. Margaret Gregory died in Exeter in 1979.

The Legion Of Honour was established by Napoleon in 1802 as France's highest Order of Merit of which he was the Grand Master. The portrait 'The Emperor Napoleon in his study at the Tuileries' (1812) by Jacques-Louis David (1748-1825) depicts him wearing a Legion Of Honour similar to that included in the lot.

Major Poppleton appears to have acquired numerous artefacts from Napoleon in addition to the silver snuff box that remained within the Martin Family in Ireland. A lock of Napoleon's hair was presented by him to Lady Georgina Bathurst (1792-1874) daughter of the 3rd Earl of Bathurst in November 1817, (Sotheby's July 14th 2015, Lot 23 English Literature, History, Children's Books & Illustrations) and another to a Mrs Riely in 1821 (David Lay 5th May, 2011, lot 2447)



7.3 If you breach these Terms of Sale, you may be responsible for damages and/or losses suffered by a Seller or us. If we are contacted by a Seller who wishes to bring a claim against you, we may in our discretion provide the Seller with information or assistance in relation to that claim.

7.4 We normally act as an agent only and will not have any responsibility for default by you or the Seller (unless we are the Seller of the Lot).

7.5 In addition to any other rights we may have to cancel a contract for sale under these Terms of Sale, in the event:

7.5.1 you are in breach of your warranties in clause 6; or

7.5.2 we have not completed our enquiries pursuant to the Money Laundering Regulations and related legislation to our satisfaction; or

7.5.3 we have reason to believe that the transaction might be unlawful for any reason, or that the sale might put us under any civil or criminal liability,

we may delay completion of a sale, delay release of a Lot or cancel the sale of a Lot.

8 PAYMENT

8.1 Immediately following your successful bid on a Lot you will:

8.1.1 give to us, if not already provided to our satisfaction, proof of identity in a form acceptable to us (and any other information that we require in order to comply with our anti-money laundering obligations – please refer to Paragraph [10] of the Information for Buyers in the Sale Catalogue); and

8.1.2 pay to us the Total Amount Due by one of our payment methods.

8.2 If you owe us any money, we may use any payment made by you to repay these debts.

9 TITLE AND COLLECTION OF PURCHASES

9.1 While you are bound by the contract for the purchase of the Lot from the fall of the hammer on your successful bid, ownership in the Lot will not pass to you until:

9.1.1 you have paid us in full the Total Amount Due in cleared funds for that Lot;

9.1.2 you have provided us with the information set out in clause 8.1.1; and

You may not claim or collect a Lot until you have paid for it and ownership has passed to you.

9.2 Unless notified otherwise, you will (at your own expense) collect any Lots that you have purchased and paid for no later than 5 working days following the day of the auction or upon the clearance of any cheque used for payment.

9.3 If you do not collect the Lot within this time period, you will be responsible for any reasonable removal, storage and insurance charges in relation to that Lot, unless the delay was caused by our continuing investigations under Clause 7.5.2.

9.4 Risk of loss or damage to the Lot will pass to you when you (or your agents) take physical possession of the Lot.

9.5 If you do not collect the Lot that you have paid for within 21 days after the auction, we may sell the Lot. We will pay the proceeds of any such sale to you, but (unless the delay was caused by our continuing investigations under Clause 7.5.2) will deduct any storage charges or other sums that we have incurred in the storage and sale of the Lot. We reserve the right to charge you a selling commission at our standard rates on any such resale of the Lot.

10 REMEDIES FOR NON-PAYMENT OR FAILURE TO COLLECT PURCHASES

10.1 Please do not bid on a Lot if you do not intend to buy it. If your bid is successful, these Terms of Sale will apply to you. This means that you will have to carry out your obligations set out in these Terms of Sale. If you do not comply with these Terms of Sale we may (acting on behalf of the Seller and ourselves) pursue one or more of the following measures:

10.1.1 take action against you for damages for breach of contract;

10.1.2 reverse the sale of the Lot to you and/or any other Lots sold by us to you;

10.1.3 resell the Lot by auction or private treaty (in which case you will have to pay any difference between the price you should have paid for the Lot and the price we sell it for as well as the charges outlined in Clause 8.5). Please note that if we sell the Lot for a higher amount than your winning bid, the extra money will belong to the Seller;

10.1.4 remove, store and insure the Lot at your expense;

10.1.5 if you do not pay us within five business days of your successful bid, we may charge interest at a rate not exceeding 1.5% per month on the total amount due; to the extent it remains unpaid for more than 28 days a late payment penalty of £40 will be charged.

Neither we nor our employees or agents are responsible for the safety of you or your property when you visit our premises, unless you suffer any injury to your person or damage to your property as a result of our, our employees' or our agents' negligence.

12 SELLER'S WARRANTIES

- 12.1 The Seller warrants to us and to you that:
 - 12.1.1 the Seller is the true owner of the Lot for sale or is authorised by the true owner to offer and sell the lot at auction;
 - 12.1.2 the Seller is able to transfer good and marketable title to the Lot to you free from any third party rights or claims; and
 - 12.1.3 as far as the Seller is aware, the main characteristics of the Lot set out in the auction catalogue (as amended by any notice displayed in the saleroom or announced by the Auctioneer at the auction) are correct.
- 12.2 If, after you have placed a successful bid and paid for a Lot, any of the warranties above are found not to be true, please notify us in writing. Neither we nor the Seller will be liable to pay you any sums over and above the Total Amount Due and we will not be responsible for any inaccuracies in the information provided by the Seller except as set out below.

We undertake that any such opinion will be honestly and reasonably held and accept liability for opinions given negligently or fraudulently.

 - 14.2.2 you personally are not able to transfer good and marketable title in the Lot to us;
 you will have no right to a refund under this Clause 13.2.
- 14.3 If you have sold the Lot to another person, we will only be liable to refund the price that you paid for the Lot. We will not be responsible for repaying any additional money you may have made from selling the Lot.
- 14.4 Your right to return a Lot that is a Deliberate Forgery does not affect your legal rights and is in addition to any other right or remedy provided by law or by these Terms of Sale.

15 OUR LIABILITY TO YOU

- 15.1 We will not be liable for any loss of opportunity or disappointment suffered as a result of participating in our auction.
- 15.2 In addition to the above, neither we nor the Seller shall be responsible to you and you shall not be responsible to the Seller or us for any other loss or damage that any of us suffer that is not a foreseeable result of any of us not complying with the Conditions of Business. Loss or damage is foreseeable if it is obvious that it will happen or if at the time of the sale of the Lot, we, you and the Seller knew it might happen.
- 15.3 Subject to Clause 14.4, if we are found to be liable to you for any reason (including, amongst others, if we are found to be negligent, in breach of contract or to have made a misrepresentation), our liability will be limited to the total purchase price paid by you to us for any Lot.
- 15.4 Notwithstanding the above, nothing in these Terms of Sale shall limit our liability (or that of our employees or agents) for:
 - 15.4.1 death or personal injury resulting from negligence (as defined in the Unfair Contract Terms Act 1977);
 - 15.4.2 fraudulent misrepresentation; or
 - 15.4.3 any liability which cannot be excluded by law.

16 NOTICES

- 16.1 All notices between you and us regarding these Terms of Sale must be in writing and signed by or on behalf of the party giving it.
- 16.2 Any notice referred in Clause 15.1 may be given:
 - 16.2.1 by delivering it by hand;
 - 16.2.2 by first class pre-paid post or Recorded Delivery; or
 - 16.2.3 by email, provided that a copy is also sent by pre-paid post or Recorded Delivery.
- 16.3 Notices must be sent:
 - 16.3.1 by hand or registered post:
 - a. to us, at our address set out in these Terms of Sale or at our registered office address appearing on our Website; and
 - b. to you, at the last postal address that you have given to us as your contact address in writing; or

16.3.2 by email:

- a. to us, by sending the notice to the following email address: enquiries@bhandl.co.uk
- b. to you, by sending the notice to any email address that you have given to us as your contact email address in writing.

16.4 Notices will be deemed to have been received:

- 16.4.1 if delivered by hand, on the day of delivery;
 - 16.4.2 if sent by first class pre-paid post or Recorded Delivery, two business days after posting, exclusive of the day of posting; or
 - 16.4.3 if sent by email, at the time of transmission unless sent after 17.00 in the place of receipt in which case they will be deemed to have been received on the next business day in the place of receipt (provided that a copy has also been sent by pre-paid post or Recorded Delivery as set out in Clause 15.2.3.
- 16.5 Any notice or communication given under these Terms of Sale will not be validly given if sent by email, any form of messaging via social media or text message.

17 DATA PROTECTION

We will hold and process any personal data in relation to you in accordance with our current privacy policy, a copy of which is available on www.bhandl.co.uk/privacy.

18 GENERAL

- 18.1 We may, acting reasonably, refuse admission to our premises or attendance at our auctions by any person.
- 18.2 We act as an agent for our Sellers. The rights we have to claim against you for breach of these Terms of Sale may be used by either us, our employees or agents, or the Seller, its employees or agents, as appropriate. Other than as set out in this Clause, these Terms of Sale are between you and us and no other person will have any rights to enforce any of these Terms of Sale.
- 18.3 We may use special terms in the catalogue descriptions of particular Lots. You must read these terms carefully along with any glossary provided in our auction catalogues.
- 18.4 Each of the clauses of these Terms of Sale operates separately. If any court or relevant authority decides that any of them are unlawful, the remaining clauses will remain in full force and effect.
- 18.5 We may change these Terms of Sale from time to time, without notice to you. Please read these Terms of Sale carefully, as they may be different from the last time you read them.
- 18.6 Except as otherwise stated in these Terms of Sale, each of our rights and remedies are: (a) are in addition to and not exclusive of any other rights or remedies under these Terms of Sale or general law; and (b) may be waived only in writing and specifically. Delay in exercising or non-exercise of any right under these Terms of Sale is not a waiver of that or any other right. Partial exercise of any right under these Terms of Sale will not preclude any further or other exercise of that right or any other right under these Terms of Sale. Waiver of a breach of any term of these Terms of Sale will not operate as a waiver of breach of any other term or any subsequent breach of that term.
- 18.7 These Terms of Sale and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with them (including any non-contractual claims or disputes) shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of England and the parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

2. **ATTRIBUTED TO SIDNEY RICHARD PERCY** – In our opinion probably a work by the artist but less certainty as to authorship is expressed than in the preceding category.
3. **STUDIO OF SIDNEY RICHARD PERCY** – In our opinion a work by an unknown hand in the studio of the artist which may or may not have been executed by under the artist's direction.
4. **CIRCLE OF SIDNEY RICHARD PERCY** - In our opinion a work by an as yet unidentified but distinct hand – closely associated with the named artist but not necessarily his pupil.
5. **STYLE OF . . . ; FOLLOWER OF SIDNEY RICHARD PERCY** - In our opinion a work by a painter working in the artist's style, contemporary or nearly contemporary, but not necessarily his pupil.

9. The term bears a signature and/or date and/or inscription means that in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription have been added by another hand.
10. Dimensions are given height before width.


