Jean-Louis-Ernest Meissonier is perhaps best known for his historical and academic paintings. His work as a sculptor was relatively unknown even within his own lifetime- an artistic practice limited to smaller more private works largely for his own entertainment and

practical use. It is likely that he modelled workusually horse related- in wax and clay in order to achieve better and more realistic depictions in his paintings. After his death it seems that his heirs licensed reproduction of some of these works in bronze in order to help pay off the debts he'd accrued. It is thought that this particular model was used for the painting "La Campagne de France, 1814" (now in at the Musée d'Orsay). Other bronze casts from the Siot-Decauville foundry are held in museums in Bordeaux and Lille.





In their present form as side cabinets, they can be usefully compared with a single cabinet made by Riesener in 1773 for Pierre-Elisabeth de Fontanieu, the Intendant et Contrôleur Général des Meubles de la Couronne, for his own official residence in the Place Louis XV in Paris. Fontanieu's cabinet was in the famous collection of John Jones, bequeathed to the Victoria & Albert Museum in 1882. Like the present pair, the cabinet was converted from a corner cupboard, probably in the mid-19th century (V&A 1082-1882).



Another comparison is with the commode in the Hôtel du Garde Meuble, Paris (Al-Thani collection) which Riesener delivered in 1775 for the bedroom of Madame Randon de Pommery, wife of the Garde-Général of the Garde Meuble de la Couronne. The commode is fitted with almost identical central apron mounts and has strikingly similar guilloche panels to the side frieze drawers - interspersed with comparable oval paterae mounts above comparable scrolling floral feet mounts. The commode was sold from the Desmarais Collection, Christie's New York, 30 April 2019 lot 51, \$1,155,000.

On the 31st March 2014, Her Majesty The Queen unveiled the life-size bronze statue of her Windsor Greys, Daniel and Storm. The term Windsor Grey is used for the grey horses used to draw the carriages and coaches in various Royal ceremonial processions including when the Monarch is Trooping the Colour. They are stabled in the Royal Mews.

Her grandson, the then Duke of Cambridge, was patron of the public fundraising appeal which raised £200,000 to have these horses sculpted and cast by the artist Robert Rattray in commemoration of The Queen's Diamond jubilee. There were just four maquette size models of the statue cast. Due to his generous donation to the appeal the late owner was gifted this maquette. 



The celebrated Cary family business of scientific instrument and globe makers was established by John Cary at Johnson's Court, Fleet Street, London in 1782 moving to a new address at 'Corner of Arundel Square', Strand the following year. In 1802, Antonio Canova was asked if he would fashion a copy of the Medici Venus which Napoleon had removed from Florence to the Musée Napoléon in Paris. Although he agreed to make a copy, the sculpture that he eventually completed in 1811 was quite different from the Medici Venus. It shows a more modest figure, who largely covers her nakedness with a large swag of drapery and lacks the dolphin and the figure of Cupid that accompany the Medici Venus.

Canova produced various versions of this figure: the original now in the Palatine Gallery of The Pitti Palace another in the Residenzmuseum in Munich, and the third in Hearst Castle, San Simeon, California, (formerly in the Lansdowne Collection). A fourth version was sold from the Londonderry collection in 1962 and is today in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.

In 1820 he also completed a version for Thomas Hope (1769-1831). This version, which Canova in fact liked best of all those he had made, was rather closer in appearance than the others to the Venus de'Medici. It is now in Leeds City Art Galleries.

The present lot is an even more creative example than the version mentioned above as each candelabra is surmounted by a cherub and the legs to the front are headed by figural busts.

The bronze mounts such as the side cherubs and the Mars infant surmounting the clock are reminiscent of the work by Léon Messagé and they could have been cast after his designs. Indeed, evidences have been found that he has not exclusively worked for François Linke but also for Krieger, Zwiener, Roux et Brunet and then possibly Millet.

In that respect, this piece can be considered as one of the most interesting in maison Millet's production.

As mentioned by Mestdagh, Théodore Millet exhibited a very similar bureau en rognon at the 1905 Paris Salon des industries du Mobilier.

(b) "deliberate forgery" means an imitation made with the intention of deceiving as to authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source but which is unequivocally described in the catalogue as being the work of a particular creator and which at the date of the sale had a value materially less than it would have had if it had been in accordance with the description:

(c) "hammer price" means the level of bidding reached (at or above any reserve) when the auctioneer brings down the

(d) "terms of consignment" means the stipulated terms and rates of commission on which Dreweatts accepts instructions from sellers or their agents;

(e) "total amount due" means the hammer price in respect f the lot sold together with any premium, Value Added Tax chargeable and any additional charges payable by a defaulting buyer under these Conditions;
