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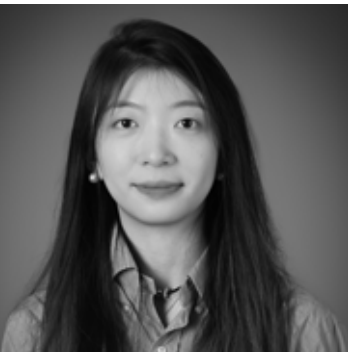

CELESTIAL CRAFTSMANSHIP SYMBOLS OF POWER AND VIRTUE

A DISTINGUISHED COLLECTION OF CHINESE AND
MUGHAL TREASURES | LOTS 1-49 & LOTS 492-530

Gold was the chief symbol of prestige and incorruptibility for the elite in most ancient cultures. Jewellery and decorative objects made of gold have long been considered as a sign of wealth and status, and royal ornaments were extravagantly adorned with gold. Yet where gold dazzled, jade cradled the virtues of sages and was considered a symbol of immortality, with its deep spiritual and cultural significance often linked to the harmony of the universe.

Mughal jade carving began in the early 17th century during the reign of Emperor Jahangir (r. 1605–1627). Jade was crafted into a wide range of items, including vessels, weapon ornaments, and personal adornments. Like his Timurid ancestors, Jahangir was a passionate collector of jade artifacts. Mughal jades are renowned for their exquisite craftsmanship, characterised by remarkably thin walls, flawlessly polished surfaces, and intricate floral motifs executed with exceptional precision. Many pieces were further embellished with gold inlays and semiprecious stones, enhancing their elegance.

Perhaps the greatest Imperial collector in China's long history of artistic appreciation was the Emperor Qianlong (1736-95). Examples of Mughal jades were presented to the Emperor largely as tribute gifts from Muslim rulers and officials based in Xinjiang province. He was so impressed with them that he composed numerous poems in praise of them. Chinese jade craftspeople sought to please the Emperor by copying Mughal pieces and creating works with a high degree of transparency and perfect uniformity.

Dreweatts is honoured to present the private collection of exquisitely crafted Chinese (Day 1) and Mughal (Day 2) gold and jade objects. With a stunning selection of scholar's objects, hair ornaments, earrings, daggers and cosmetic boxes, etc., the collection showcases remarkable craftsmanship and the fine taste of the collector.

夫黃金者，自古帝王貴冑之重器。黃金制成的珠寶與裝飾品歷來被視為財富與身份的標識，皇室器物更以奢華的黃金裝飾彰顯尊榮。而美玉則被賦予德性、恒久、祥瑞之義，其深厚的精神文化內涵常與乾坤和諧相契。

莫臥兒治玉之藝，肇興於賈漢吉爾汗御極之初（1605–1627）。良玉被雕琢成各式器皿、武器飾件及個人佩飾。這位帝王如同其帖木兒王朝的祖先一般，對玉器收藏傾注了極大熱忱。莫臥兒玉器亦以精絕工藝聞名——纖薄如紙的器壁、瑩潤無瑕的拋光，以及以超凡精準度呈現的繁覆花卉紋飾，皆為其標志性特征。許多作品還飾以黃金鑲嵌與珍貴寶石，更添華貴氣韻。

在中國悠久的藝術鑒藏史上，乾隆皇帝（1736–1795）或許是最具影響力的宮廷收藏家。回部所貢莫臥兒玉器深愜帝心，盛贊其「在手疑無物，定睛知有形」，並題寫了大量讚詩。中原玉工為迎合聖意，不僅臨摹莫臥兒玉作，更追求極致的鑲嵌工藝與純潔的玉質。

德物茲拍賣行本次非常榮幸為全球藏家呈獻一組私人珍藏的中國（5月21日）與莫臥兒（5月22日）金玉珍品。從文房清供、鬢釵珥璫，以至短兵妝奩等等，此系列藏品既展現了令人嘆服的工藝水準，亦折射出藏家非凡的審美旨趣。

Excavations have revealed that these intriguing fittings are chariot ornaments once used to crown the curved ends of the yoke that was fitted around the horse's neck. Similar 'tiger' fittings, either gilt-bronze or gilt-and-silvered bronze, were excavated in the Han Tombs of Mancheng, Heibei province. See the excavation report, *Mancheng Hanmu Fajue Baogao* [Excavation of the Han Tombs at Mancheng], vol. 1, Beijing, 1980, p. 322-3, fig. 219-1 for illustration and fig. 215 for a reconstructed diagram showing where these fittings were originally placed.

It was a practice of the Khitan royals to cover the face of the deceased with a metal mask. Recent archaeological excavations have recovered numerous masks from Liao tombs in Inner Mongolia and Liaoning, the home base of the semi-nomadic Khitans from the 10th through the 12th century. The nomadic Khitan people buried their high-ranking men and women with various amounts of metal body attire such as a mask like this one for the face and a suit "woven" from wire for the body. The masks were highly personalized and fashioned in a variety of shapes and sizes, the type of metal depending on the class of the wearer. The simplest were made of thinly hammered bronze, in rare cases, silver, gilt bronze and high karat gold were reserved for the elite. See similar examples in the Musée Guimet, Paris, reference no. Gold and silver were not as highly coveted in China as in other ancient cultures such as the Roman or the Parthian civilisations, but came to play a more central role in Chinese society by the beginning of the Tang dynasty (AD 618-907) when frequent trade contacts between China and its western neighbours developed along the Silk Roads. Chinese goldsmiths often imitated the foreign shapes and styles of the imported goods and developed new techniques under the influence of Central Asian craftsmen who had settled in Chinese urban centres beginning in the mid 7th century.

This cup was probably used to drink alcohol and clearly shows how foreign shapes were imitated during the Tang dynasty. Compare with a similar example with incised detailed at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, accession number M.30-1935

Examples with a handle similar to that on the present cup, include the cup illustrated in Tang, Eskenazi, London, 1987, no. 8, which is decorated with scrolling grapevine and peony scroll on a ring-punched ground, and two others illustrated in Zui to no bijutsu, Osaka Municipal Museum, 1976, nos. 2-28 and 2-30. The handle on the Eskenazi cup is described as being 'pinned to the cup through a floral applique.'

Openwork 'dragon' hairpins with a hollowed shaft have been fashionable since the 12th century in China. Compare with a very similar Song-Dynasty example at the Shanghai Museum excavated from the Tan Bolong tomb, Yuepu Town, Baoshan District in Shanghai in 1978. This hairpin style is known as *tongzan*. For further discussion and illustrated examples of this type, refer to *Zhongguo Gudai Jinyin Shoushi*, Yang Zhishui (Beijing: Gugong, 2014), vol. 3, pp. 828-829. The distinct craftsmanship and stylistic elements of Hindustan jade which originated from the Mughal court, garnered Emperor Qianlong's admiration. He hence commissioned the Palace Workshops to emulate these foreign models while integrating traditional techniques. Enamelling techniques developed in the West were introduced into China through Jesuit missionaries and tribute items made for the court. The attractive *basse-taille* technique of this scabbard is an enamelling technique that was introduced into China from Europe towards the end of the 18th century. This technique consists of applying transparent enamels onto a metal body that has been carved with patterns in relief or repousse. While low-fired wares were produced in several locations in China, this scabbard is an example of the spectacular high-fired variety that was only produced in Guangzhou. The combination of *basse-taille* enamels with inlaid coloured glass is unusual and rarely seen on Chinese weaponry. Compare a hunting knife with very similar *basse-taille* enamelled scabbard from the Qing Court collection in Beijing, Palace Museum, accession number gu 00173319-1/14. Also see a jewelled sword with *basse-taille* sold Sotheby's, 6 July 2016, Lot 33.

Knives of this type appear to have been originally hunting knives which were designed for use in the wilderness. Its function was altered to a degree, although it continued being used on hunts, when it became part of the Manchu ceremonial attire as well as being used at meals, an indication of the bearer's Manchu identity. Also see the Qianlong imperial knife with jade handle and gold scabbard decorated with turquoise, coral and lazurite inlays in the Palace Museum, Beijing, illustrated by Ho and Bronson, *Splendors of China's Forbidden City: The Glorious Reign of Emperor Qianlong*, The Field Museum, Chicago, 2004, p. 201, no. 248, with the author's comment: "The use of personal knives at meals was a mark of Manchu identity. When eating sacrificial pork, not only men but also women were expected to cut up their own meat." A similar knife and scabbard suspended from an imperial court belt is illustrated in the same catalogue, op. cit., p. 59, fig. 52 and another is shown in a detail image from an official portrait of the Qianlong emperor in full regalia, op. cit., p. 59, fig. 53.

Ceremonial court belts of the Qing dynasty emperor with all suspended accessories including similar knives in fitted scabbards in the National Palace Museum, Taipei, are illustrated in *Qing dai fushi zhanlan tulu* (Catalogue of the Exhibition of Ch'ing Dynasty Costume Accessories), Taipei, 1986, pp. 114-115, nos. 32 and 33. The Qing Imperial collection of swords, daggers and other arms included a number of these Mughal and Mughal-style daggers which were used by the army. Many of the daggers were gifts to the Qianlong emperor from foreign dignitaries from India and the Middle East, thus introducing a new and exotic style to Chinese weaponry. The decoration on the handles suggests that the present daggers may have come from Mughal India or Iran. However, it is also possible that they were made in the Imperial ateliers, exactly copying the Mughal style from the collection of arms. Christie's noted in the sale in 2000 that: 'a close inspection of the polish on these daggers suggests that these were made in the Near East where diamond dust was used to polish jades, an uncommon practice in Chinese workshops.'

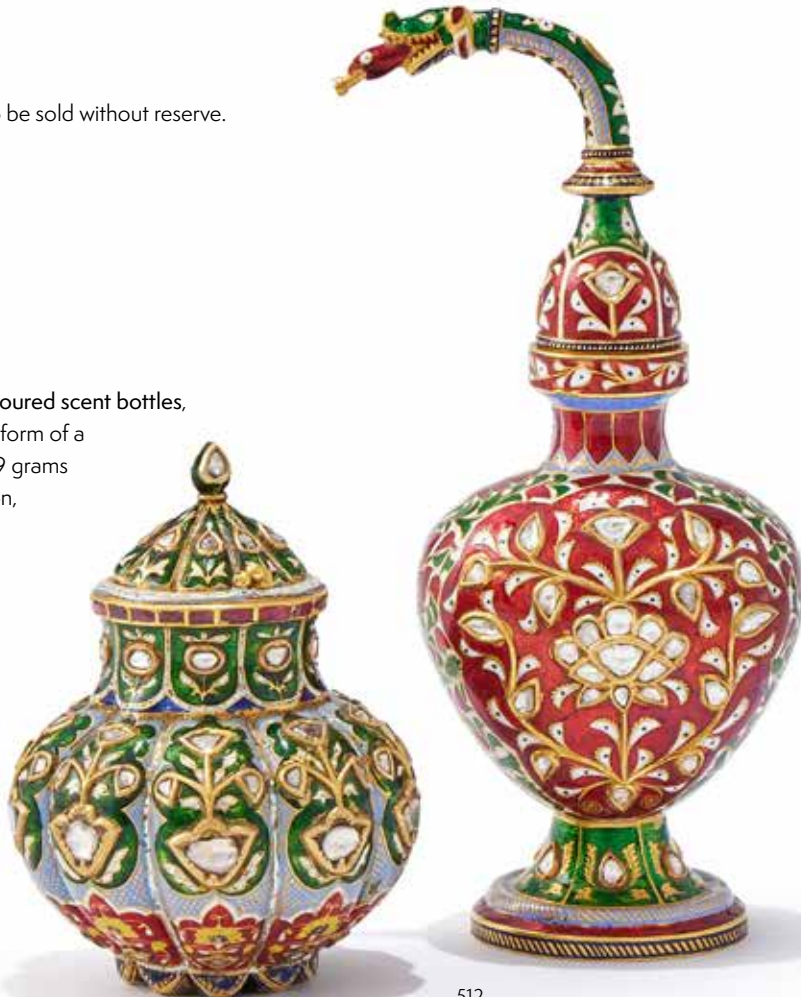

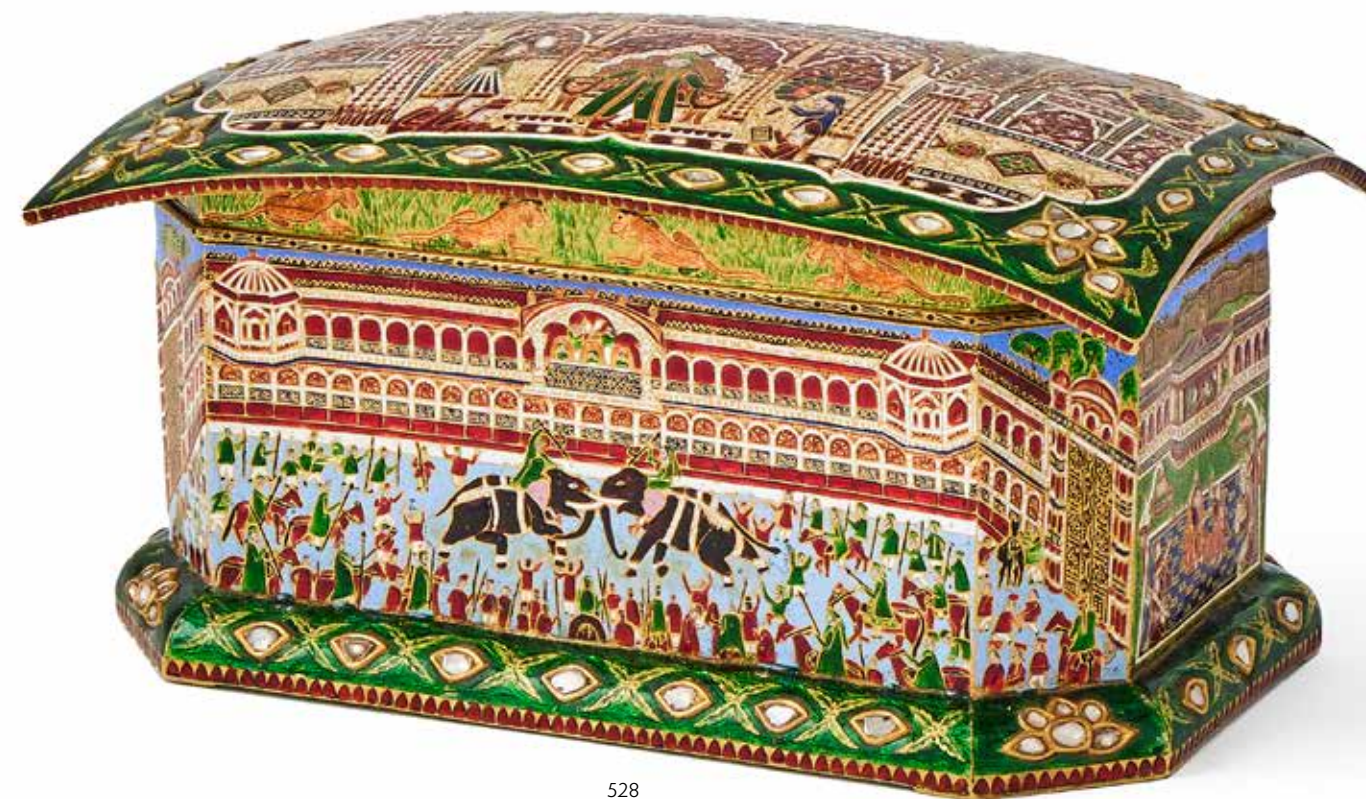

By bidding at the auction, you agree to be bound by these terms.

2. **AGENCY.** As auctioneers we usually act as agents for the seller whose identity, for reasons of confidentiality, is not normally disclosed. Accordingly if you buy at auction your contract for the item or items purchased is with the seller and not with us as the auctioneer.

3. **ESTIMATES.** Estimates are designed to help buyers gauge what sort of sum might be involved for the purchase of a particular lot. 7. **ELECTRICAL GOODS.** These are sold as 'antiques' only and if bought for use must be checked over for compliance with safety regulations by a qualified electrician before use.

8. **EXPORT OF GOODS.** Buyers intending to export goods should ascertain (a) whether an export licence is required and (b) whether there is any specific prohibition on importing goods of that character because, e.g. they may contain prohibited materials such as ivory. Ask us if you need help.

12. **COLLECTION AND STORAGE.** Please note what the Conditions of Sale state about collection and storage. It is important that goods are paid for and collected promptly. Any delay may involve the buyer in paying storage charges.

13. **λ ARTIST'S RESALE RIGHT (DROIT DE SUITE) ROYALTY CHARGES.** Under Artist's Resale Right (ARR) UK art market professionals (including, but not limited to, auctioneers, art dealers and galleries) are required to collect a royalty for works of art produced by qualifying artists each time a work is resold during the artist's lifetime and for a period up to 70 years following the artist's death. This payment is only applicable to qualifying works of art when the hammer price reaches or exceeds £1,000. If you, or another person acting on your behalf, provide goods to us to sell on your behalf at one of our auctions this signifies that you agree to and will comply with our Auction Terms and Conditions including these Terms of Consignment for Sellers in Public Auctions and our Conditions of Sale for Public Auctions.

1. **INTERPRETATION.** In these Terms the words 'you', 'yours', etc. refer to the Seller and if the consignment of goods to us is made by an agent or otherwise on the Seller's behalf we assume that the Seller has authorised the consignment and that the consignor has the Seller's authority to contract. All obligations that apply to the Seller under these Terms of Consignment for Sellers in Public Auctions shall apply to the owner of the goods and their agent jointly and separately. Similarly the words 'we', 'us', etc. refer to the Auctioneers.

2. **WARRANTY.** The Seller warrants that possession in the lots can be transferred to the Buyer with good and marketable title, free from any third party right and encumbrances, claims or potential claims. The Seller has provided all information concerning the item's ownership, condition and provenance, attribution, authenticity, import or export history and of any concerns expressed by third parties concerning the same.

3. **ALL COMMISSIONS.** and fees are subject to VAT at the prevailing rate.

4. **COMMISSION.** is charged to sellers and all selling terms are available from our salerooms.

5. **REMOVAL COSTS.** Items for sale must be consigned to the saleroom by any stated deadline and at your expense. We may be able to assist you with this process but any liability incurred to a carrier for haulage charges is solely your responsibility.

6. LOSS AND DAMAGE OF GOODS

(a) Loss and Damage Warranty - Dreweatts is not authorised by the FCA to provide insurance to its clients, and does not do so. However Dreweatts for its own protection assumes liability for property consigned to it at the lower pre-sale estimate until the hammer falls. To justify accepting liability, Dreweatts makes a charge of 1.5% of the hammer price plus VAT, subject to a minimum charge of £1.50, or if unsold 1.5% of our lower estimate. The liability assumed by Dreweatts shall be limited to the lower pre-sale estimate or the hammer price if the lot is sold. 8. **MINIMUM BIDS AND OUR DISCRETION.** Goods will normally be offered subject to a reserve agreed between us before the sale in accordance with clause 9. We may sell Lots below the reserve provided we account to you for the same sale proceeds as you would have received had the reserve been the hammer price. If you specifically give us a "discretion" we may accept a bid of up to 10% below the formal reserve.

9. RESERVES

(a) You are entitled to place prior to the auction a reserve on any lot consigned, being the minimum hammer price at which that lot may be sold. The rights of disposal referred to in clause 10 and 11 are subject to the provisions of The Torts (Interference with Goods) Act 1977.

12. **DESCRIPTION.** Please assist us with accurate information as to the provenance, lawful import etc. of goods where this is relevant. There is strict liability for the accuracy of descriptions under modern consumer legislation and in some circumstances responsibility lies with sellers if inaccuracies occur. We will assume that you have approved the catalogue description of your lots and that your lots match those descriptions unless informed to the contrary. Where we are obliged to return the price to the buyer when the lot is a deliberate forgery under Condition 15 of the Conditions of Sale and we have accounted to you for the proceeds of sale you agree to reimburse us the sale proceeds and in any event within 7 days of our written notice to do so.

13. **UNSOLD.** If an item is unsold it may at our discretion be re-offered at a future sale. Where in our opinion an item is unsaleable you must collect such items from the saleroom promptly on being so informed. Otherwise, storage charges may be incurred. We reserve the right to charge for storage in these circumstances at a reasonable daily rate.

14. **WITHDRAWN AND BOUGHT IN ITEMS.** These are liable to incur a charge of 15% commission, 1.5 % Loss and Damage Warranty and any other costs incurred including but not limited to illustration and restoration fees all of these charges being subject to VAT on being bought in or withdrawn after being catalogued.

15. **CONDITIONS OF SALE.** You agree that all goods will be sold on our Conditions of Sale for Public Auctions. In particular you undertake that you have the right to sell the goods either as owner or agent for the owner with good and marketable title and free and clear of any third party rights or claims. You undertake to compensate us and any buyer or third party for all losses liabilities, costs and expenses suffered or incurred arising out of or in connection with any breach of this undertaking. We will also, at our discretion, and as far as practicable, confirm that an item consigned for sale does not appear on the Art Loss register, which is administered by an independent third party.

16. **DUE DILIGENCE CHECKS AND ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING PROCEDURES.** Under the money laundering regulations in force we are required to carry out relevant due diligence checks. This includes verifying the identity of all customers we transact with as well as any beneficial owners on behalf of whom they may transact. Vendors who are unable to or refuse to supply required identification documents and proof of address will not be able to consign to Dreweatts auctions. Copies of customer due diligence checks will be stored for as long as it is necessary to satisfy legal requirements in an appropriate storage facility, which for the avoidance of doubt may include storage solely in electronic form. We reserve the right to withhold the monies owed until the vendor provides the information necessary to complete the anti-money laundering checks.

17. AUTHORITY TO DEDUCT COMMISSION AND EXPENSES AND RETAIN PREMIUM AND INTEREST

(a) You authorise us to deduct commission at the stated rate and all expenses incurred for your account from the hammer price and consent to our right to retain beneficially the premium paid by the buyer in accordance with our Conditions of Sale for Public Auctions and any interest earned on the sale proceeds until the date of settlement.

(b) In case of lots unsold at auction you authorise us at our discretion to reoffer such lots and negotiate a sale within seven days of the auction date, in which case the same charges will be payable as if such lots had been sold at auction and so far as appropriate these Terms apply.

18. **WAREHOUSING.** We disclaim all liability for goods delivered to our saleroom without sufficient sale instructions and reserve the right to make minimum warehousing charge of £10 per lot per day. Unsold lots are subject to the same charges if you do not remove them within a reasonable time of notification. If not removed within three weeks we reserve the right to sell them and defray charges from any net proceeds of sale or at your expense to consign them to the local authority for disposal.

19. **SETTLEMENT.** After sale settlement of the net sum due to you normally takes place within 28 days of the sale unless the buyer has not paid for the goods or the checks necessary under the current Money Laundering Regulations have not been completed. In this case no settlement will then be made but we will take your instructions in the light of our Conditions of Sale for Public Auctions. You authorise any sums owed by you to us on other transactions to be deducted from the sale proceeds. You must note the liability to reimburse the proceeds of sale to us as under the circumstances provided for in Condition 12 above. You should therefore bear this potential liability in mind before parting with the proceeds of sale until the expiry of 28 days from the date of sale.

1. **DEFINITIONS**

(a) “auctioneer” means the firm of Dreweatts or its authorised auctioneer, as appropriate;
(b) “deliberate forgery” means an imitation made with the intention of deceiving as to authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source but which is unequivocally described in the catalogue as being the work of a particular creator and which at the date of the sale had a value materially less than it would have had if it had been in accordance with the description;
(c) “hammer price” means the level of bidding reached (at or above any reserve) when the auctioneer brings down the hammer;
(d) “terms of consignment” means the stipulated terms and rates of commission on which Dreweatts accepts instructions from sellers or their agents;
(e) “total amount due” means the hammer price in respect of the lot sold together with any premium, Value Added Tax chargeable and any additional charges payable by a defaulting buyer under these Conditions;

2. **BIDDING PROCEDURES AND THE BUYER**

(a) If any Lot is not paid for in full and taken away in accordance with these Conditions or if there is any other breach of these Conditions, we, as agent for the seller and on our own behalf, shall at our absolute discretion and without prejudice to any other rights we may have, be entitled to exercise one or more of the following rights and remedies:
(i) to proceed against you for damages for breach of contract;
(ii) to rescind the sale of that Lot and/or any other Lots sold by us to you;
(iii) to resell the Lot (by auction or private treaty) in which case you shall be responsible for any resulting deficiency in the total amount due (after crediting any part payment and adding any resale costs). Any surplus so arising shall belong to the seller;
(iv) to remove, store and insure the Lot at your expense and, in the case of storage, either at our premises or elsewhere;
(v) to charge interest at a rate not exceeding 1.5% per month on the total amount due to the extent it remains unpaid for more than 3 working days after the sale;
(vi) to retain that or any other Lot sold to you until you pay the total amount due;
(vii) to reject or ignore bids from you or your agent at future auctions or to impose conditions before any such bids shall be accepted;

Save as expressly set out above, all other warranties, conditions or other terms which might have effect between the Seller and you, or us and you, or be implied or incorporated by statute, common law or otherwise are excluded to the fullest extent permitted by law.
12. **AGENCY.** The auctioneer normally acts as agent only and disclaims any responsibility for default by sellers or buyers.

13. **TERMS OF SALE.** The seller acknowledges that Lots are sold subject to the stipulations of these Conditions in their entirety and on the Terms of Consignment for Public Auctions as notified to the consignor at the time of the entry of the Lot.
14. **DESCRIPTIONS AND CONDITION**
(a) Whilst we seek to describe lots accurately, it may be impractical for us to carry out exhaustive due diligence on each lot. Prospective buyers are given ample opportunities to view and inspect before any sale and they (and any independent experts on their behalf) must satisfy themselves as to the accuracy of any description applied to a lot. Prospective buyers also bid on the understanding that, inevitably, representations or statements by us as to authorship, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price involve matters of opinion. We undertake that any such opinion shall be honestly and reasonably held and accept liability for opinions given negligently or fraudulently. Subject to the foregoing neither we the auctioneer nor our employees or agents nor the seller accept liability for the correctness of such opinions and all conditions and warranties, whether relating to description, condition or quality of lots, express, implied or statutory, are hereby excluded. Dreweatts is not liable for damage to gilded picture frames, plaster picture frames or picture frame glass; if the Lot is or becomes dangerous, we may dispose of it without notice to you in advance in any manner we see fit and will be under no liability for doing so. This Condition is subject to the next following Condition concerning deliberate forgeries and applies save as provided for in paragraph 6 “information to buyers”.
(b) Private treaty sales made under these Conditions are deemed to be sales by auction for purposes of consumer legislation.
15. **FORGERIES.** Notwithstanding the preceding Condition, any Lot which proves to be a deliberate forgery (as defined) may be returned to us by you within 21 days of the auction provided it is in the same condition as when bought, and is accompanied by particulars identifying it from the relevant catalogue description and a written statement of defects. If we are satisfied from the evidence presented that the Lot is a deliberate forgery we shall refund the money paid by you for the Lot including any buyer’s premium provided that (1) if the catalogue description reflected the accepted view of scholars and experts as at the date of sale or
(2) you personally are not able to transfer a good and marketable title to us, you shall have no rights under this condition.
The right of return provided by this Condition is additional to any right or remedy provided by law or by these Conditions of Sale.
16. **PRIVACY NOTICE.** We will hold and process any personal data in relation to you in accordance with our current privacy policy, a copy of which is available on our website www.dreweatts.com/privacy-policy/.
GENERAL
17. We shall have the right at our discretion, to refuse admission to our premises or attendance at our auctions by any person.
18. (a) Any right to compensation for losses liabilities and expenses incurred in respect of and as a result of any breach of these Conditions and any exclusions provided by them shall be available to the seller and/or the auctioneer as appropriate.
(b) Such rights and exclusions shall extend to and be deemed to be for the benefit of employees and agents of the seller and/or the auctioneer who may themselves enforce them.
19. Any notice to any buyer, seller, bidder or viewer may be given by first class mail, email or Swiftmail in which case it shall be deemed to have been received by the addressee 48 hours after posting.
20. Special terms may be used in catalogue descriptions of particular classes of items in which case the descriptions must be interpreted in accordance with any glossary appearing at the commencement of the catalogue.
21.
