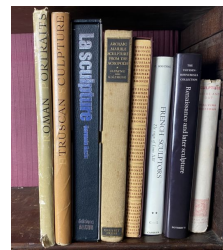

They have been stored in an attic for several decades until very recently discovered. This pair of carvings or wall appliques appear to have been copied from a section of carving by James Richards (1671-1759) and designed by William Kent (1685-1748) for the stern of the Royal barge built for Frederick Louis, Prince of Wales (1707-1751). James Richards was master sculptor and carver in wood to the Crown who succeeded the renowned carver Grinling Gibbons to the post in 1721. The barge was in use by the Crown after Prince Frederick's death and during the 19th century continued to be used for Royal occasions, it was last used in 1849 by Prince Albert, the Princess Royal and the Prince of Wales. After 1849 the barge was stored in the Royal Barge House at Windsor Great Park. In 1883 it was added to the collection of the Art Museum / Science Museum (which together formed the South Kensington Museum, which in turn became the V&A Museum) In 1849 the barge was cut into three sections to be shown at the International Fisheries Exhibition held in London the same year. After the event the Science Museum retained the sections and in 1924 they were transferred to the V&A Museum, where the parts were reassembled and displayed. In 1952 the barge was transferred to the National Maritime Museum where it was fully restored and it still remains. 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commodes are veneered in satinwood and banded in purplewood and incorporate similar marquetry shells, while the shell decoration on the commode offered here is more complex, the Workington Commode features highly unusual figurative panels. The commodes both have the same 'French' feet, overhanging tops and identical detailed chevron banding. The coloured design for the Workington commode appears in the Gillow Estimate Sketch book for 1788 and is reproduced in L.Boynton, Gillow Furniture Designs 1760-1800, Hertfordshire 1995, colour plate 12. Similar shell marquetry in combination with a plain purplewood elliptical panel on the top appears on the satinwood marquetry card table stamped Gillow of Lancaster and London and illustrated in S. Stuart, Gillow of Lancaster and London, 1730-1840, Vol. 2, Suffolk, 2008, pl.GG63, p.393 In 1788, the prominent cabinetmakers Gillows of Lancaster crafted an exceptional satinwood commode for John Christian, M.P., intended for his Dressing Room at Workington Hall, one of his Cumbrian estates. This semi-circular commode exemplifies the firm's most ambitious work of the period, featuring four doors, inlaid shell motifs, and elaborate marquetry. The piece cost Gillows £11.5s.0d. to produce and was sold to Christian for £13.18s.0d., yielding a 24% profit. The commode's refined design includes rich satinwood veneers with purplewood and tulipwood inlays, a top overhanging slightly to accommodate projecting pilasters, and French feet. The most remarkable decorative elements are the two inlaid ovals on the central doors, depicting a Cumbrian miner and a local girl carrying a "swill" basket—a highly unusual choice in English furniture design, which typically favoured classical or mythological subjects. Christian, a wealthy landowner with significant mining interests, was known for his progressive political views and advocacy for the working class. A member of the Society of Friends of the People, he likely commissioned these figures as a tribute to the local labour force. The Workington commode is notable not only for its craftsmanship and social symbolism but also because it marks a rare instance where Gillows attempted figural inlay. No other known pieces from the firm during the 18th century include similar motifs. Christian also commissioned a pair of commodes of this form from the Gillow firm which appear in the Gillow Estimate sketch books for 28 June 1786 and which remain untraced. The pair of commodes were made for his round house 'Belle Isle' on Lake Windermere named after his wife, the heiress Isabella Curwen whom he married in 1782. These commodes appear plain in the Gillow Estimate sketch books but the Gillow historian Ned Pakenham has noted that often, even into the 19th

The Ziegler carpet company, founded in the late 19th century, played a pivotal role in the evolution of Oriental carpet design and trade, particularly in adapting Persian rug styles to Western tastes. The company was established in 1883 by C.G. Ziegler & Co., a Manchester-based Anglo-Swiss firm, in Sultanabad (modern-day Arak), in central Persia (Iran). At a time when Persian carpet production was largely focused on traditional domestic and regional markets, Ziegler saw a growing demand from the European and American upper classes for high-quality, handwoven carpets. What set Ziegler apart was its pioneering business model. Rather than simply exporting existing Persian rugs, Ziegler set up its own workshops in Persia and employed local weavers to produce rugs tailored to Western market preferences. These preferences included softer color palettes, larger sizes, and more open, spacious designs that suited Victorian and Edwardian interiors. The company's artists and designers, many of them European, would often supply stylized, simplified versions of traditional Persian motifs, merging the richness of Persian craft with Western aesthetics. The most famous rugs produced by Ziegler were known as Ziegler Mahal carpets—made in the Sultanabad/Mahal region and distinguished by their decorative, large-scale floral patterns and subtle, elegant coloring. These carpets became immensely popular, especially in Britain and the United States. Ziegler's influence extended beyond commerce into the transformation of Persian rug design. By introducing more standardization in quality and pattern and offering better pay and conditions for weavers than many local producers, the company helped elevate the reputation of Persian carpets internationally. He is best known for pioneering what he described as “organic wood painting”—a unique technique in which images are painted translucently into the surface of planed timber, allowing the natural grain of the wood to interact with the composition and lend it a subtle, organic depth. Portner’s artistic education was cosmopolitan in nature, reflecting his European upbringing and intellectual curiosity. He studied art in Amsterdam, Paris, and Berlin, immersing himself in the diverse modernist traditions that shaped mid-20th-century European painting. These formative years equipped him with a refined technical skillset and a wide-ranging stylistic vocabulary. With the onset of World War II, Portner relocated to Britain and served in the British Army—a transformative period that would influence the emotional and psychological tone of his later work. After the war, he settled permanently in London and embarked on a prolific exhibiting career. Portner showed in numerous prestigious mixed exhibitions, including at the Royal Academy, the Royal Institute of Oil Painters, and Wildenstein’s. He was also the subject of several solo exhibitions at prominent venues such as the Walton Gallery, the New Art Gallery, and the Madden Gallery, with additional solo shows in South Africa and the United States. He became particularly know for his society and theatrical portraits. His work is held in both public and private collections, notably at St John’s College, Oxford, and in collections across the UK and America. Throughout his career, Portner remained committed to figurative and expressive modes of painting, distinguished by a subtle interplay between material surface and human subject. 
